Police Reports\$10
Includes the first 10 pages; \$0.25 (25 cents) for each additional page thereafter. An additional
\$10 fee will be charged for certified copies, including Call for Service (CAD) reports
Research fee\$25
Name check / background clearance letter\$10
Body Worn Camera (Blurred video) (Non-Refundable Deposit)
After the Non-refundable deposit is paid, an LPD Digital Media Technician (DMT) will provide a summary report to the Requester with the estimated total (based on number of videos, average length of videos, at \$30/recorded hour multiplied by three (3)). If the Requester approves the estimated total, then the DMT will begin the blurring process. The Requester will be responsible for the entire cost of service if the blurring process begins.
BWC requests will be processed within 21 days of request, unless the release would substantially interfere with or jeopardize an active or ongoing investigation and shall be released within 45 days.

Body Worn Camera Cost Estimation

The processing and blurring of Body Worn Camera (BWC) video takes an estimated three times longer than the original video length. The cost estimation below is based on the total number of cameras present and; the average length of videos recorded. This number is then multiplied by three for the blurring process.

Body Worn Camera (BWC) Disclaimer

Digital Video Recording Requestor,

The Littleton Police Department acknowledges that any video recording is only representative of one perspective of an event and that a camera "sees" differently than the human eye. An officer's recall of an event, particularly in a critical, acute-stress, encounter may be distinct from any other view.

The officer's report is a synopsis of the investigation and is not meant to be a transcript or complete accounting of every detail or circumstance contained within any digital video recording device footage collected. Furthermore, the report may include additional information regarding what the officer is actually seeing or perceiving during the event that may not be captured in the video footage. Similarly, if the report includes information regarding recorded interviews or actions by an officer, it should be treated as a summary of those interviews or actions, and it is not a transcript, and may not be in chronological order as reported by the victim(s), witness(es), and/or suspect(s). Direct quotes will be noted with "quotation marks."

It is recognized there are limitations to any recorded video footage, and the idea that recordings can capture the full story should be taken with caution. Footage sometimes fails to provide important context and can be subject to biases and varying interpretations. Examples of known limitations of any camera device include but are not limited to, predictive imaging may not capture movements seen by the human eye, a camera recording only captures an event in a two-dimensional view, from a single perspective, danger cues observed by an officer may not always be captured or visible on the recording, and cameras are unable to accurately capture what the human eye sees, particularly in low-light conditions.
